Re: Water Collection In The Alley

As you know, the Town Hall parking lot was dirt-filled and gravelled during Fall of 1979 resulting in a large quantity of surface run-off water from part of that parking lot, plus the blacktopped area in front of the school to be collected on the town alley in front of the Greenville School. This will result in icy and slippery road conditions providing a safety hazard for children attending the school and increasing accident rates between buses and normal traffic in this alley.

I asked Mr. Homer Sarabi from my office, and Mr. Dan Cristiani to look into the problem and give me a cost estimate to correct the problem which totals \$1,880. It appears that the best resolution would be to install a catch basin in the low spot, where the alley and Town Board parking lot meet, and install 8" underground PVC pipe to carry the water to a drainage ditch on the south side of Clark Street on the east side of Cross Street.

Because this problem is considered to be a problem both to the School Corporation and the Town Board, it is proposed that we share the cost equally or \$940 each.

An early reply is requested to do the job before weather prevents doing the work.

ORDINANCE NO. 80-02

An Ordinance establishing rates and charges for the use of and services rendered by the waterworks system of the Town of Greenville

WHEREAS, the Town of Greenville owns and operates a waterworks by and through its Board of Trustees, and desires to make certain extensions and additions thereto, and finance the cost thereof from the issuance and sale of bonds payable from the net revenues of the waterworks; and

WHEREAS, the existing rates and charges for services furnished by the water utility of the Town of Greenville were initially established by Ordinance and are now inadequate to provide for the proper operations and maintenance of said waterworks, the setting aside of a proper fund for extensions and replacements, and the payment of the interest on and principal of the oustanding Water Revenue Bonds, dated December 1, 1963, and the revenue bonds required to be issued to finance said proposed extensions and additions: and

WHEREAS, it will be necessary to increase the existing rates and charges in order to provide sufficient funds to meet the financial requirements of said water utility and to enable the Town to issue the revenue bonds; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE, INDIANA:

Section 1. That there shall be and there are hereby established for the use of and the service rendered by the water system of the Town of Greenville, the following rates and charges, based on the use of water supplied by said water system:

WHEREAS, on the 5th day of February, 1980, the Board of
Trustees of the Town of Greenville duly adopted an Ordinance
increasing the rates to be charged by the Water Utility of the
Town of Greenville, and the Board of Trustees, upon due consideration
of the new rates, has deemed it necessary and proper that the connection
fee of \$290.00 be further increased in order to provide sufficient funds
to meet the financial requirements of said Water Utility, now, therefore,

WHEREAS, it will be necessary to increase the existing rates and charges in order to provide sufficient funds to meet the financial requirements of said water utility and to enable the Town to issue the revenue bonds; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE, INDIANA:

Section 1. That there chall be and those one bounty constitutes

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Greenville, Indiana, met in the Town Hall, its regular meeting place in said Town, on the 14th day of February, 1980 in regular session pursuant to notice in accordance with the rules of the Board.

The meeting was called to order by Jack Sprigler, President of the Board, who presided.

The President stated that it would now be in order for the Board of Trustees to consider Ordinance 80-03 prepared and submitted to the Board for its consideration by Max C. Mason, Jr., Town Attorney. The President of the Board announced that Ordinance 80-02 which had been adopted by the Board on February 5, 1980, the same pertaining to increased rates to be charged by the Water Utility of the Town, included the sum of \$290.00 as a connection fee for a 5/8 inch meter, but that subsequently to the adoption of Ordinance No. 80-02, Gary Getrost, Supervisor of the Water Utility, had computed the minimum cost of such a connection to be \$350.00. After a full and in-depth

discussion, H. L. Spears moved that Ordinance No. 80-02 be repealed which motion was seconded by V. J. Miller and on a call of the roll was adopted by the following votes:
