Robert Gibson opened the meeting. All members of the Board were present. Also present were Ernest Purvis, Janice Gibson, James Harl, Robert Tilly, R. W. Miller, Dan Cristiani, and one visitor.

Claims were presented and approved for payment.

The treasurer's report as of March 31, 1976, shows a checking fund balance of \$12,308.25. (General \$3,256.38, Localroads \$657.90, Street \$5,291.93, and CCIF \$3,102.04.) The Revenue Sharing checking fund has a balance of \$3,412.15.

Janice Gibson's water utility receipts for March 1976 appear to agree with the bank statement.

Paul Walker of the Security Tank and Tower Corporation gave his sales presentation on the job of cleaning, painting and maintenance work on both the interior and exterior of the two water towers owned by the Greenville Water Utility. The cost would amount to \$2,100.00 on each tank, for a total \$4,200.00. His contract guaranteed the paint for a period of three years with a twelve-year guarantee on the maintenance portion. The Board advised Mr. Walker to leave the contract in their possession until a decision could be made. The Board wishes to consult with Mr. Walker's previous customers in this area before signing the contract.

Dan Cristiani has purchased a boring machine in order to do drilling under the road and difficult places of this sort for the Town. The Board has agreed to hire Dan Cristiani to do all such jobs at the rate of \$35.00 per job - with the agreement to run for a period of one year.

The Board recognized the fact that Richard Boyd was not paid for his labor in painting the older of the two marshall's cars late last year. A claim draft is being prepared for Mr. Boyd's signature and a check will be delivered to him in the near future. The amount concerned is \$40.00.

James Lewis, owner of seventeen acres on Pekin Road, has been given water rights by the Board.
