Minutes of Greenville Town Council Meeting April 12th, 2010

Council President Talbotte Richardson called the regular monthly meeting to order. Other Councilpersons present were Bob Wright, James Pearce, Patti Hayes and Randal Johnes, along with Clerk Jack Travillian. Also attending the meeting were Water Utility Superintendent Gary Getrost, town attorney Rick Fox, and other concerned citizens. The meeting was opened with a prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes: President Richardson made a motion and Councilman Johnes seconded to accept the March 8th monthly minutes as amended by Councilman Johnes. Motion passed 5-0. The Special Meeting minutes were not ready but will be discussed at next month's meeting.

Marshal's Report:

The marshal's department has written 43 traffic tickets in the past month. The department has responded to theft, burglary & counterfeiting cases. The three reserve officers have completed the reserve academy.

2010-R-017 RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A HOME AT 9423 HARRISON STREET IN THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE, INDIANA Resolution was read and discussed. A motion was made by Councilman Johnes and seconded by Councilwoman Hayes to accept the resolution. Motion passed 5-0.

2010-T-009 ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE ADOPTION OF THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE BUILDING CODES AND REGULATIONS 2010 FOR THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE, INDIANA; First reading was completed and a discussion was held. Don Lopp from the Floyd County Planning Commission had some questions about the wording of the Ordinance. The wording was amended to read "rezoning". A motion was made by Councilman Johnes and seconded by President Richardson to accept the resolution as amended. Motion passed 3-2 with Councilman Pearce and Wright voting against.

Schuler Road Intersection: The council had requested Floyd County restructure Schuler Road and US Highway 150 intersection for safety reasons. Don Lopp stated the county's position as the intersection is in the Town of Greenville; therefore it should fall under the town's jurisdiction. Clerk Travillian pointed out that the town does not own the road and does not do maintenance it even if it does run into town corporate limits; therefore it is the county's responsibility. Mr. Lopp stated the town should consider applying for grants from KIPDA (Kentuckiana Regional Planning and Development Agency) to help with the cost.

Mr. Lopp stated the county will consider the request for replacing the bridge on Clark Street.

Water Business:

Superintendent Getrost submitted monthly adjustments to the council. The board approved the adjustments for the bills (5-0).

Hydraulic Study: Jacobi, Tomes, & Lanz had two engineers present at the monthly meeting to give a report on the hydraulic study for the service area of the Greenville Municipal Water Utility. The council requested a report giving recommendations for tank replacement or repairs.

Superintendent Getrost reported about a request from a resident living on Old Vincennes Road not presently being serviced in our water area requesting purchasing bulk water through the stand pipe on Clark Street. The resident has a failing well located on his property. Town Attorney Fox stated the water board would need to set up a bulk rate pricing structure. Superintendent Getrost noted also that the resident would need to be on the honor system due to the lack of metering devise on the stand pipe that is primarily used for emergency vehicles (fire trucks). The council was concerned with how often the resident would need to be using the fill station and the additional pricing structure needed. This might also increase the likelihood of other residents requesting the same type of services. The council rejected the request and noted the best solution appears to be for the resident to contact a water conditioning service that will most likely be a cheaper and better resolution in the long run.

The Greenville Township Volunteer Fire Department is requesting a new hydrant be installed at the Galena Fire Station 2 location (7020 Highway 150). The council approved of the proposal and requested Superintendent Getrost build a list of locations in need of new hydrants and present it at next month's meeting.

Superintendent Getrost requested the council start easement requests for putting a new connecting water main between Clark Street and US Highway 150 using Cross Street as the location. This would need an easement from two property owners on Cross Street.

Financial:

Review/Approval Checks and Expenditures: Clerk Travillian presented the forms for the checks written from the utility and the town.

Committee Reports

Public Relations: Councilwoman Hayes has received multiple calls asking why the council was opposed to the proposed Dollar General store. Councilwoman Hayes has informed most persons that contacted her that the council was in support of new business and the council gave their approval when the owner approached at the regular monthly meeting several months ago.

Streets & Roads

Bids for Clark Street: The council opened the sealed bids for the Clark Street project. The project has been separated into four stages. The bids were received from Striegel Paving and Libs Paving.

Wind Dance: A resident has requested the town look into the drainage issue on the East side of the main entrance. The council believes this is on private property and not the town's responsibility.

Property in 9900 Block of Highway 150: A resident in the 9900 block of highway 150 was sent a letter requesting his presents at the regular monthly meeting and did not appear. The resident has also begun construction without approval. The council requested Marshal Moore serve a "cease and desist order" to stop the construction immediately.

Emergency Services:

Councilman Wright presented Clerk Travillian with a bill for ammunition from the police department for use during firearms training. The payment will not be available until next month's meeting.

Life Insurance for Police Officers: The council has received notice of a rate increase for the authorized life insurance policy due to personal circumstances. The council will hold an executive session on Monday April 19, 2010 at 6:00 PM.

Special Meeting; Councilman Johnes requested a special meeting be scheduled to review several ordinances including a lengthy tattoo ordinance from the Floyd County Health Department. The meeting was set for March 22 at 6:30 PM at the town hall.



ORDINANCE CONCERNING REGULATING THE DISPOSAL OF DEAD ANIMALS REQUESTED BY THE FLOYD COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT, FLOYD COUNTY, INDIANA ENFORCEABLE WITHIN CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE, INDIANA

WHEREAS, the Town Council for the Town of Greenville, Indiana, in the interest of public health, safety and welfare, and in cooperation with the Floyd County Health Department, and

WHEREAS, under I.C. 16-20-1-23 the Floyd County Health Department may order what is reasonable and necessary for prevention and suppression of disease and in all reasonable ways protect the public health; and

WHEREAS, the Floyd County Health Department and the Floyd County Commissioners deem it reasonable and necessary for the prevention and suppression of disease to adopt regulations related to the disposal of dead animals; and

WHEREAS, I.C.15-17-11-20 sets forth the duties of an owner or caretaker with respect to any dead animal located on his or her property; and

WHEREAS, 345 IAC 7-7-1 et seq. establishes regulations with respect to the disposal of dead animals.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS:

I. Definitions

- a. "Animal" means any domestic animal, exotic animal, or wild animal.
- b. "Dead animal" means an animal that has died other than by slaughter.
- c. "Domestic animal" means (1) cattle, calves, horses, mules, swine, sheep, goats, dogs, cats, poultry, ostriches, rhea, emus, or other birds; (2) an animal of the bovine, equine, ovine, caprine, porcine, canine, feline, avian, camelid, cervidae, or bison species; or (3) an aquatic animal that may be the subject of aquaculture (as defined in I.C. 15-11-17-1).
- d. "Exotic animal" means a flesh-eating wild animal.
- e. "Owner" means any person who owns, keeps, possesses, or harbors an animal.
- f. "Wild animal" means an animal that is not a domestic animal.

II. Disposal

- a. A person who owns or cares for an animal that has died from any cause shall dispose of the animal's body not later than twenty-four (24) hours after knowledge of death so as not to produce a nuisance. The disposal of the animal's body must be by one (1) of the following methods:
 - (1) At an approved disposal plant.
- (2) Burial upon the owner's premises to such a depth that every part of the animal's body is at least four (4) feet below the natural surface of the ground and every part of the animal's body is covered with at least four (4) feet of earth in addition to any other material that may be used as cover.
- (3) Thorough and complete incineration according to standards established by an appropriate governmental agency.
- (4) Composting according to standards approved by the Indiana State Board of Health.
- b. Upon discovery of a dead animal by the New Albany/Floyd County Animal Control and/or the Floyd County Health Department, the owner shall be notified, if known, and shall be ordered to dispose of the remains immediately. If the owner is unknown, the animal control officer or health department representative shall notify the owner of the property upon which the remains are located and shall order the owner of the property to dispose of the remains immediately.
- c. New Albany-Floyd County Animal Control shall dispose of any dead animals located on public property, but only if the owner of the dead animal cannot be notified.

III. Violations

- a. If the owner of a dead animal fails to dispose of the dead animal within 24 hours after receiving notice to dispose of said animal, the health officer or his designated representative shall cause the remains to be disposed of in a suitable manner.
- b. The owner of the dead animal and/or the owner of the property on which the dead animal is located shall be liable for all costs associated with the removal of the dead animal by the health officer or his designated representative as well as any costs incurred in collecting the costs of removal including but not limited to attorney fees.

IV. Effect

- a. Nothing in this ordinance shall be deemed to limit or contravene the provisions of I.C. 15-17-11-1 et seq.
- b. All provisions of all prior ordinances adopted by the Board of Commissioners for Floyd County, Indiana not specifically contradicted herein shall remain in full force and effect.

FLOYD COUNTY ORDINANCE 2010-FCO-___

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE DISPOSAL OF DEAD ANIMALS

WHEREAS, under I.C. 16-20-1-23 the Floyd County Health Department may order what is reasonable and necessary for prevention and suppression of disease and in all reasonable ways protect the public health; and

WHEREAS, the Floyd County Health Department and the Floyd County Commissioners deem it reasonable and necessary for the prevention and suppression of disease to adopt regulations related to the disposal of dead animals; and

WHEREAS, I.C.15-17-11-20 sets forth the duties of an owner or caretaker with respect to any dead animal located on his or her property; and

WHEREAS, 345 IAC 7-7-1 et seq. establishes regulations with respect to the disposal of dead animals.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Commissioners for Floyd County, Indiana as follows:

V. Definitions

- a. "Animal" means any domestic animal, exotic animal, or wild animal.
- b. "Dead animal" means an animal that has died other than by slaughter.
- c. "Domestic animal" means (1) cattle, calves, horses, mules, swine, sheep, goats, dogs, cats, poultry, ostriches, rhea, emus, or other birds; (2) an animal of the bovine, equine, ovine, caprine, porcine, canine, feline, avian, camelid, cervidae, or bison species; or (3) an aquatic animal that may be the subject of aquaculture (as defined in I.C. 15-11-17-1).
- d. "Exotic animal" means a flesh-eating wild animal.
- e. "Owner" means any person who owns, keeps, possesses, or harbors an animal.
- f. "Wild animal" means an animal that is not a domestic animal.

VI. Disposal

- a. A person who owns or cares for an animal that has died from any cause shall dispose of the animal's body not later than twenty-four (24) hours after knowledge of death so as not to produce a nuisance. The disposal of the animal's body must be by one (1) of the following methods:
 - (1) At an approved disposal plant.
- (2) Burial upon the owner's premises to such a depth that every part of the animal's body is at least four (4) feet below the natural surface of the ground and every part of the animal's body is covered with at least four (4) feet of earth in addition to any other material that may be used as cover.
- (3) Thorough and complete incineration according to standards established by an appropriate governmental agency.
- (4) Composting according to standards approved by the Indiana State Board of Health.
- d. Upon discovery of a dead animal by the New Albany/Floyd County Animal Control and/or the Floyd County Health Department, the owner shall be notified, if known, and shall be ordered to dispose of the remains immediately. If the owner is unknown, the animal control officer or health department representative shall notify the owner of the property upon which the remains are located and shall order the owner of the property to dispose of the remains immediately.
- e. New Albany-Floyd County Animal Control shall dispose of any dead animals located on public property, but only if the owner of the dead animal cannot be notified.

VII. Violations

- a. If the owner of a dead animal fails to dispose of the dead animal within 24 hours after receiving notice to dispose of said animal, the health officer or his designated representative shall cause the remains to be disposed of in a suitable manner.
- b. The owner of the dead animal and/or the owner of the property on which the dead animal is located shall be liable for all costs associated with the removal of the dead animal by the health officer or his designated representative as well as any costs incurred in collecting the costs of removal including but not limited to attorney fees.

VIII. Effect

- a. Nothing in this ordinance shall be deemed to limit or contravene the provisions of I.C. 15-17-11-1 et seq.
- b. All provisions of all prior ordinances adopted by the Board of Commissioners for Floyd County, Indiana not specifically contradicted herein shall remain in full force and effect.
- c. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage.
