MINUTES - TOWN COUNCIL OF GREENVILLE

August 11, 2003

The regular monthly meeting of the Greenville Town Council was called to order by Council President Leon R. Gibson with members Hanzel Barclay, Ted Miller and Mike Receveur and Clerk Treasurer Jack Sprigler present; member David Matthews was absent.

Also attending was Utility Superintendent Gary Getrost, Marshal D. Moore, and other interested persons.

A Petition Against Annexation was presented to the Council regarding the Reisert property (U.S. 150); signed by both Town and Township residents.

The minutes of the July meeting was approved by majority vote of the Council.

The Council approved the hiring of Ms. Amy Stone for the clerical position with the Utility in the absence of Janice Gibson who was placed on Medical Leave of Absence effective August 8, 2003. Ms. Stone will be paid an hourly rate \$9.25 with employment effective July 30, 2003.

Since many residents were in attendance concerning the annexation of the Reisert property Council President Gibson stated the Council would not take any action of any annexation.

Don Thieneman, developer, questioned the Council on the status of the water availability study for the proposed subdivision he was planning to develop (Reisert property). Gary Getrost, Utility Supt. stated the current situation and that the Town has not received information regarding water availability. Mr. Les Archer, engineer, explained he was pursuing the matter (study) and an answer would be forthcoming in about thirty (30) to sixty (60) days. Mr. Thieneman requested the Council approve fifteen (15) taps for the year 2004 and twenty-five (25) taps for the year 2005 and for the Council give him a letter of approval. The Council advised him they could not do so until the water study is completed.

Carolyn Dale, Town resident at 9357 Arthur Coffman Road complained of numerous cats running loose on her property. She stated she believes they come from the residents at the end of Clark Street (by the Water Tower). Council stated they would look into the matter.

Council approved (4-0) claims for the Town (to be paid from Town funds) and for the Utility (to be paid from Utility funds).

No further business coming before the Council the meeting was adjourned.
