Minutes of Greenville Town Council Meeting December 9th, 2019

President Greg Redden called the regular monthly meeting to order. Other Councilpersons present were Andy Lemon, David Gomes, and Kyle Kruer along with Clerk Jack Travillian. Also attending the meeting were Greenville Water Superintendent Audi Findley, town attorney Heather Peters and several concerned citizens. The meeting was opened with a prayer from President Redden followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes: The minutes for November 11th regular meeting was discussed. Motion was made by Councilman Lemon and seconded by Councilman Gomes to accept the minutes. Motion passed 4-0.

Police Report:

Police Chief Craig gave an update on the K-9 unit and training. There was a complaint about property on Highway 150 by East 3rd with construction waste. Chief Craig requested permission to post the cleanup citation by taping to the door, due to the lack of response upon several visitations. The neighbor was at the meeting and noted that he had contacted the resident several times and nothing was done.

Financial:

Review/Approval Checks and Expenditures: Clerk Travillian presented the forms for the checks written from the utilities and the town. The checks were approved.

Committee Reports:

Streets and Roads:

The street signs have arrived for Parkland Heights subdivision upgrade. Councilman Lemon will contact a contractor about installation. The Stop sign for Heritage Springs will be purchased and the Home Owners Association will reimburse for any additional cost for the upgrade version.

Special Projects:

The placement of the new town welcome sign is awaiting INDOT approval for the location per engineer design.

Stellar Quality of Life Committee report update: Councilman Kruer noted that this year's recipient has received around 30 million dollars. Floyd County is partnering with the Towns of Greenville and Georgetown on the application, which should be submitted by the end of April.

Floyd County will create an updated comprehensive plan for \$600. The council agreed to pay for this from the Economic Development (EDIT) fund.

Attorney Report:

Codification of Ordinances: the publication company has been sent all ordinances by Amy Stone in the Water Utility with direction from Attorney Peters.
