AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF GARAGE AND YARD SALES

WHEREAS, the Town Board of Greenville may, pursuant to the provisions of I.C. 1971, 18-3-1-48, make and establish such by-laws, ordinances, and regulations, not repugnant to the laws of the State of Indiana, as may be reasonably necessary for the conduct of town affairs and for the protection of the health, welfare, and safety of the residents of the Town and of the public; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of I.C. 1971, 18-3-1-41, the Town Board of Greenville may license, regulate or restrain certain commercial activities, to include the sale of wares and merchandise within the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of Greenville has deemed it necessary and appropriate to enact an ordinance having as its purpose the regulation of yard or garage sales conducted by residents and others within the limits of the Town.

NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED, no person, firm or corporation shall conduct or cause to be conducted within the corporate limits of the Town of Greenville, a garage or yard sale without first having made application to, and received from, the Clerk-Treasurer of the Town of Greenville a permit authorizing said sale. The permit issued by the Clerk-Treasurer shall disclose the name of the person, firm, or corporation to whom issued; the date of issuance; and location where the sale is to be conducted; the duration of the sale, which shall not in any event exceed 48 hours; and, said permit shall clearly state thereon the following prohibition:

No sign or other advertising material to be used in conjunction with the sale for which this permit is issued shall be erected or situated upon any street, road, or highway right-of-way within the Town, or at or upon any publicly owned or operated real estate, building, or establishment.

For purposes of this ordinance, the term "garage or yard sale" shall be deemed to include the sale or barter, not in the course of an established trade or business, of household goods, house wares, clothing or other personal property, conducted at or upon real estate within the Town of Greenville used predominantly or primarily for residential purposes, and for which a special exception or variance has not been issued by the Floyd County Plan Commission and/or Floyd County Board of Zoning Appeals permitting the commercial sale of such property or merchandise thereon.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Clerk-Treasurer of the Town of Greenville, upon issuance of a permit pursuant to this ordinance, shall collect from the applicant a fee of One Dollar (\$1.00).

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that within a period of thirty (30) days, not more than one permit shall be issued to any single applicant, and not more than one permit shall be issued for the conduct of a garage or yard sale at any single location within the Town of Greenville. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a permit issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be plainly and openly displayed by the applicant at the location stated thereon and at all times during the conduct of the sale authorized thereby.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any person, firm, corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance or any of the terms or provisions of a permit issued pursuant hereto, shall be subject to a fine or penalty of \$25.00 pursuant to the provisions of I.C. 1971, 18-3-1-49 and shall be subject to prosecution pursuant to the provision of I.C. 1971, 18-3-1-53 or other applicable statutes of the State of Indiana.

An Ordinance to License and regulate Public Exhibits and Shows for pay.

- Sec 1-Be it ordered by the Board of Trustees of the incorporated Town of Greenville. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to exhibit for pay any Theatre Exhibits or Magic Lantern, Moving Pictures, Slight of Hand, Circus, or any kind of show whatever until said person or persons shall first procure from the incorporated Town of Greenville, Indiana a license granting said person or persons the right to hold and exhibit to show.
- Sec 2nd-All shows or exhibits under the various names shall be in two divisions: Town Tent Shows & Hall Shows.
- Sec 3rd- A license of One Dollar And Fifty Cents(\$1.50) shall be required for a Tent Show for each and every exhibit. A license of One Dollar(\$1.00) shall be required for Hall Shows for each and every exhibit.
- Sec 4th-The License shall be procured as follows by said person or persons desiring to show and exhibit first paying into the Town Treasure the sum of One Dollar and Fifty Cents(\$1.50) for Tent Shows or the sum of One Dollar(\$1.00) for Hall shows and take the Treasures receipt for the amount and present the same to the Town Clerk who shall thereupon issue said license to said person or persons to exhibit their show.
- Sec 5th-All persons violating the provisions of the above ordinance shall forfeit and pay the sum of One Dollar and Fifty Cents(\$1.50) for each and every performance of a Tent Show and the sum of One Dollar(\$1.00) for each and every performance of Hall Shows.
- Sec 6th-All other ordinances pertaining to the regulation and license of Public Exhibit are hereby repealed.
- Sec 7th-The above ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage. Dated this 1st day of February, 1910.

AN ORDINANCE TO DEFINE, LICENSE, TAX, REGULATE AND RESTRAIN TRAVELING PEDDLERS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE IN GREENVILLE TOWNSHIP, FLOYD COUNTY, INDIANA, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR LTS VIOLATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF GREEN-VILLE, IN GREENVILLE TOWNSHIP, FLOYD COUNTY, INDIANA:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to peddle as a traveling peddler meat, fruits, vegetables, melons, produce, dairy products, or any other goods, wares and merchandise, anywhere within the Town limits of the Town of Greenville, Indiana, without having first obtained a license so to do.

Section 2. The words "traveling peddler" are defined as meaning all persons, firms or corporations who sell or offer for sale the property described in Section 1, directly to a user or consumer, either by going from house to house, for the purpose of selling and delivering such property, or for the purpose of taking orders for a future delivery thereof, or persons, firms or corporations selling and delivering such property from a vehicle, pack or other container, in any street, alby, public square, or other public place in said Town. Section 3. This ordinance shall not apply to farmers, gardners, fruit growers, or dairymen, selling products grown or produced by themselves; or to residents delivering such property from an established place of business, owned or conducted by him in said town.

Section 4. This ordinance shall not apply to any person now or hereafter exempted by laws of the State of Indiana, from the payment of license fees for traveling peddlers, but shall apply to all employees, helpers, servants and agents of the person so exempted.

Section 5. Any person, firm or corporation desiring to obtain a license hereunder shall make written application to the Town Clerk, setting forth the applicant's name, place of residence, the character of merchandise he proposes to sell, and shall verify the same, and pay to the Town Clerk the license fee of One Hundred (\$100) Dollars. Whereupon such Clerk shall issue to the applicant a license containing the name of the persons to whom issued, the date of the State of Indiana) (ss County of Floyd)

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PARKING IN THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Greenville:

Section One:

This Ordinance shall be known as the Parking Control Ordinance of the Town of Greenville and is enacted for the purpose of providing for the safety of the citizens of the Town of Greenville.

ORDINANCE NO. 1988- 07

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING FEES FOR OUT-OF-STATE VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER INSPECTIONS

WHEREAS, Public Law 29, House Enrolled Act 1243, amending IC 9-1-2 enacted by the 1988 Legislature and effective July 1, 1988, now permits law enforcement officers of the state to charge a fee for inspection of vehicles which must be inspected prior to registration in the State of Indiana; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board deems it desirable to impose a fee for inspecting applicable motor vehicles, which fee is not a greater charge for the service than that reasonable related to the cost of the service provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Board of Greenville, Floyd County, Indiana, that from and hereafter the date of passage and adoption of this Ordinance, the Marshalls' Department of the Town of Greenville is authorized and directed to collect a fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for the inspection process for each motor vehicle which must be inspected prior to registration in the State of Indiana.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a receipt shall be issued by the Marshalls' Department for each such inspection fee collected; that the revenues so collected shall be remitted weekly to the Town of Grenville Clerk-Treasurer who shall issue a receipt for funds collected and deposit same in the "Special Vehicle Inspection Fund". Expenditures for such funds, after appropriation, shall be used for law enforcement purposes.

FURTHER, ORDINANCE 1984-1, dated the 8th day of May 1984 is hereby rescinded by passage and adoption of this ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 1984-2

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF THE GREENVILLE WATER UTILITY LAKE AND FACILITY

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Board of the Town of Greenville, Floyd County, Indiana, that:

1. Requirements concerning the use of grounds and facilities:

Each person, firm or corporation using the grounds shall clean up all debris, extinguish all fires when such fires are permitted, and leave the premises in good order, and the facilities in a neat and sanitary condition.

2. Prohibited acts:

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation using such facilities to either perform and permit to be performed any of the following acts:

- a. Willfully mark, deface, disfigure, injure, tamper with, or displace or remove any building, bridges, tables, benches, fireplaces, railings, paving or paving material, waterlines or other public utilities or parts or appurtenances thereof, sings, notices or placards whether temporary or permanent, monuments, stakes, posts, or other boundary markers, or other structures or equipment, facilities or lake property or appurtenances whatsoever either real or personal.
- b. Throw, discharge, or otherwise place or cause to be placed in the waters of the lake, stream, bay, or other body of water in or adjacent to the lake or tributary, stream, storm sewer, or drain flowing into such waters, any substance, matter or thing, liquid or solid, which will or may result in the pollution of said waters.
- c. Bring in or dump, deposit or leave any bottles, broken glass, ashes, paper, boxes, cans, dirt, rubbish, waste, garbage, or refuse, or other trash. No such refuse or trash shall be placed in any waters in or contiguous to said lake, or left anywhere on the grounds thereof, but shall be placed in the proper receptacles where these are provided; where receptacles are not so provided, all such rubbish or waste shall be carried away from the area by the person responsible for its presence, and properly disposed of elsewhere.
- d. Disturb the peace, or use any profane, obscene or blasphemous language.
- e. Endanger the safety of any person by any conduct or act.
- f. Commit any assult, battery, or engage in fighting.
- g. Carry, possess, or bring any alcoholic beverage in the facility.
- h. Violate any rules for the use of the facility including closing hours as posted, said rules being made or approved by the Town Board of the Town of Greenville, Indiana.
- Prevent any person from using the lake or any facility or interfer with such use in compliance with this ordinance and the rules applicable to such use.
- j. Swim or bathe in any waters or waterways in or adjacent to the lake.
- k. To have in their possession any type of firearms, or any type of martial arts weapons, i.e. knucks.
- 3. Picnic Areas and Use:

No person shall picnic or lunch in a place other than those designated for that purpose.

4 Other Regulations:

a. Special Activities:

It shall be unlawful to engage in special activities including flying model airplanes, flying model rockets, operating model speed boats, golf practice, ice skating, archery, games and picnics except at locations specifically designated.

b. Automobiles:

It shall be unlawful to drive or park any automobile or motor vehicle c any type, except on a street, driveway or parking lot in the facility; or to park or leave such vehicle in any place other than one establishe for public parking. All vehicles shall observe a 15 mile per hour spee limit.

c. Watercraft:

It shall be unlawful to operate watercraft on the lake; i.e. boats, canoes, etc. Exception to this is Water Department and State Department of Natural Resources.

d. Animals:

It shall be unlawful to ride a horse in the area./

It shall be unlawful to bring any dangerous animal into the facility ar it shall be unlawful to permit any dog to be in the facility.

It shall be unlawful to hunt or molest wildlife in the facility.

e. Sales:

It shall be unlawful for any person to vend, sell, peddle or offer for sale any commodity or article within the facility.

f. Signs:

It shall be unlawful for anyone to paste, glue, tack or otherwise post any sign, placard, advertisement, or inscription whatever, nor shall an person erect or cause to be erected any sign whatever on any public lands or roads adjacent to the area. Provided that these provisions shall not apply to any authorized government official in pursuit of any duty.

g. Fishing Regulations:

All persons fishing in areas under the jurisdiction of the Town Board of the Town of Greenville must conform to all rules, regulations and State Laws set forth by the Department of Natural Resources (Division of Fishing and Wildlife). The legal size fish will be determined by th Department of Natural Resources. Dumping of fish taken from another source is not allowed. Only artificial bait and live worms may be used NO minnow fishing allowed.

Penalty: Whoever violates any provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined not less than \$10.00 to which may be added no more than thirty (30) days in prison.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Town Board of the Town of Greenville, Indiana, and due publication thereof.

An ordinance granting franchise to the New Albany, Paoli and French Lick Valley Traction Co. its successors and assigns the right to construct, maintain, and operate a street Railway in, upon and along the Streets in the Town of Greenville, Floyd Co., Indiana.

- Sec 1-Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Greenville Floyd County, Indiana, that under and by rights of the power and authority granted by the laws of the state of Indiana in this behalf enacted consent, permission and authority is hereby given, granted and duly vested in the New Albany, Paoli and French Lick Valley Tractions Co. its successors and assigns to lay, construct, maintain and operate for the transportation of Passengers, freight, mail and express a single or double track street railway with all the necessary and convenient tracks for turnouts and side tracks and switches in, upon, along or across such streets in said Town of Greenville, Floyd County, Indiana which said Company may desire to use in the construction, maintenance and operation of said Railway, all subject to the following conditions towith:
- Sec 2nd-The cars to be run and operated by said Company its successors and assigns shall be propelled by electric power alone, unless by reason of inventions or discovery source other power superior to electric power should come into use and be adopted generally in other Towns of substantially the same size as Greenville and in said case said improvement motive power shall upon petition of said Company and upon the order of and direction of the Board of Trustees of said Town expressed in an ordinance duly passed and recorded, be adopted by said Company, its successors and assigns and used by it in the propulsion of its cars in said town, it is agreed and understood, however, that steam power shall not be used. Said New Albany, Paoli and French Lick Valley Traction Company its successors and assigns are hereby granted permission and full authority to make use of such streets of said Town as shall be necessary to enable said New Albany, Paoli and French Lick Valley Traction Company its successors and assigns to construct and maintain such structures and mechanical appliances as shall be reasonably necessary in order to construct, extend, maintain and operate such street Railway provided that no building or other structure shall be erected or maintained within the limits of said streets so as to in any way materially interrupt and impede the free use and enjoyment thereof.
- Sec 3rd-All tracks of said Railway shall be laid so as to conform to the established grade of the street and in such a manner as to be no unnecessary impediment to the original use of said street and the passage of wagons and other vehicles on the street, along and across such streets and so as not to obstruct the flow of water in and along the gutters of the street at any point should any street on which said Railway is constructed be graded so as to conform to the grade thereof; as now established the said New Albany, Paoli and French Lick Valley Traction Company its successors and assigns shall immediately change the grade

of that part of the street on which its tracks are located so that the grade thereof will conform to the grade of the street as improved unless special permission be granted by the Board of Trustees of said Town to the said company to construct its tracks to such grade as the said Company may desire.

- Sec 4th-Wherever the streets are disturbed, obstructed or damaged by reason of the construction, extension or repair of said Railway, the New Albany, Paoli and French Lick Valley Traction Company its successors and assigns shall promptly restore the same to as good condition as they were prior to such disturbance, obstruction or damage and maintain them in such condition for one year thereafter.
- Sec 5th-The tracks of said Railway shall be uniform and of standard guage.
- Sec 6th-All rails shall be of standard weight and shall not be lighter than 60 lbs. to the lineal yard.
- Sec 7th-The poles shall not be nearer together along the line of said street than 100 feet and shall be set firmly and deeply in the ground.
- Sec 8th-Said New Albany, Paoli and French Lick Valley Traction Company its successors and assigns, shall commence the construction of said railway by the first day of June, 1903 and fully complete the same by the first day of November, 1904. And all rights herein granted shall be forfeited to such streets or parts of streets not then completed unless extension of time be granted by the Board of Trustees of said Town.
- Sec 9th-The rate of fare on any line or route of said railway shall not exceed five cts. for each passenger for one continuous trip within the corporate limits of said town, and no charge shall be made for children under six years of age when accompanied by parents or guardian.
- Sec 10th-The Said New Albany, Paoli and French Lick Valley Traction Company its successors and assigns shall each day run not less than three cars each way over the entire line of road constructed within the corporate limits of said Town Provided, however, that in case the grantee is prevented from running cars by the act of God by reason of a strike among the employees or by reason of accident or other causes beyond the control of said grantees then it shall not be bound by this ordinance to run its cars until such obstacles are removed.

Sec 11th-This Ordinance shall be in force and effect after its passage and acceptance in writing by said New Albany, Paoli and French Lick Valley Traction Company. Passed and adopted this 13 day of October, 1902. R. S. Stark Town Clerk Comes now the New Albany, Paoli and French Lick Valley Traction Company this 13 day of November, 1902, and accepts the above grant and agrees to all the terms and conditions thereof.

- Sec 4th-Anyone violating any of the sections of the foregoing ordinance shall be fined in any sum not less than One Dollar(\$1.00) or more than Ten Dollars(\$10.00) which fine shall be paid into the Town Treasure.
- Sec 5th-This ordinance shall take effect immediately after the passage and the posting of the same.

ORDINANCE NO. 2004- T-35

ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE GREENVILLE ADVISORY PLAN COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, the Town of Greenville, through its Council, has decided to establish a new Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Greenville desires to establish the Greenville Advisory Plan Commission pursuant to the current Indiana Code;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN **OF GREENVILLE, INDIANA AS FOLLOWS:**

The following section of the Greenville Municipal Code and the ordinance from which the section of the code are made are hereby amended to provide as follows:

ADVISORY PLAN COMMISSION

I. CREATED AND MEMBERS

An Advisory Plan Commission of the Town of Greenville, is hereby created which shall be known as the "Town of Greenville Advisory Plan Commission", and which commission shall consist of nine (9) members, as follows:

a. The Town Council (Legislative Body) shall appoint three (3) persons, who must be elected or appointed municipal officials or employees in the municipal government as members.

b. The Town Council President (Town Executive) shall appoint four (4) citizens members, of whom no more than two (2) may be of the same political party.

c. At such time as representation within the two-mile "fringe area" shall become a factor, the executive of each county within the two-mile jurisdictional area shall appoint one (1) additional citizen member. The executive of the county having the larger portion of the unincorporated area shall appoint its member first, and the executive of the other county shall then appoint its member, who must not be of the same political party.

II. **TERMS OF MEMBERS**

1. The term of office of a member who is appointed from the membership of the Town Council is coextensive with the member's term of office on the Town Council, unless the Council, at its first regular meeting in any year, appoints another to serve as its representative.

2. Of the four (4) citizens members, two (2) citizens members shall serve initial terms of three (3) years. All other and subsequent terms of members shall be for four (4) years. Each member's terms expires on the first Monday of January of the third or fourth year, respectively, after the year of the member's appointment.

3. For members appointed to represent the unincorporated area within the jurisdiction; initially, one (1) member shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year and the other for a term of

ur (4) years. Thereafter, each appointment is for a term of four (4) years. The additional citizen ... lembers are entitled to participate and vote in all deliberations of the municipal plan commission. 4. In all other matters regarding membership, the commission will be bound by and adhere to the provisions of the 200 SERIES COMMISSION ESTABLISHMENT AND MEMBERSHIP (Indiana Code 36-7-4-200 through 299) as it relates to a Municipal Advisory Plan Commission.

III. COMMISSION ORGANIZATION

The Commission shall adhere to the provisions of Indiana Code 300 SERIES COMMISSION ORGANIZATION (Indiana Code 36-7-4-300 through 399), in all respects as it applies to Municipal Advisory Plan Commissions.

IV. POWERS AND DUTIES

The Commission shall have the power to do the following:

a. Supervise, and make rules for, the administration of the affairs of the commission;

b. Prescribe uniform rules pertaining to investigations and hearings;

c. Keep a complete record of all the departmental proceedings;

d. Record and file all bonds and contracts and assume responsibility of the custody and preservation of all papers and documents of the commission;

e. Prepare, publish, and distribute reports, ordinances, and other material relating to the activities authorized under this chapter;

f. Adopt a seal;

g. Certify to all official acts;

h. Supervise the fiscal affairs of the commission;

i. Prepare and submit an annual budget in the same manner as other departments of municipal government, and be limited to all expenditures to the provisions made for the expenditures by the fiscal body of the county of municipality.

V. MISCELLANEOUS RESPONSIBILITIES

In addition to those duties and responsibilities set forth above, the Commission shall exercise all responsibilities and obligations delegated to and imposed upon a municipal Advisory Plan Commission in the Local Planning and Zoning Statutes, Indiana Code Chapter 36-7-4.

All current sections of the Municipal Code or ordinances of the Town of Greenville which contradict these provisions are hereby repealed.
