

Minutes of Greenville Town Council Meeting January 12th, 2026

Monthly Meeting:

President Greg Redden called the regular monthly meeting to order. The other Councilpersons present were Andy Lemon, Skip Powell, and David Gomes. Also, present were Town Marshal Jordan Taylor, Town Attorney Heather Peters, Superintendent Steven Webb, Office Manager Crystal Robb, along with Clerk Jack Travillian. Other concerned citizens were also present. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Town Business:

Election of President: Councilman Powell nominated Greg Redden for President of the Council, second by Councilman Lemon. Redden was elected 2026 President by a vote of 4-0.

Minutes: Motion made by Councilman Lemon and second by Councilman Gomes to accept the minutes for the December 8, 2025, meeting. Motion passed 4-0.

Marshal Report: Jordan Taylor updated the council on the repairs to the police vehicle. The new patches for the department have arrived. The batteries have been installed in the older vehicles. Gave a report on runs for the last month, including domestic violence. Marshal Taylor has been issuing traffic tickets for speeding on highway 150, also issuing warnings for not coming to a complete stop at several locations including the stop sign on Cross Street in front of Greenville School.

Marshal Taylor is up to date with his academy training but there is a recommendation to attend Norse Training, the Marshal is reviewing when this is available.

Motion was made by Councilman Lemon and second by President Redden to purchase a new rifle spending up to \$1,800 from Riverboat Fund with an additional \$500 for ammunition. Motion passed 4-0

Review/Approval Checks and Expenditures: Clerk Travillian presented the forms for the checks written for the utilities and the town. The council approved monthly claims. There was also a report on the annual income and expenses given. The reconciling report for December 2025 was presented. Motion by President Redden and second by Councilman Powell to accept the report. Motion passed 4-0.

Committee Reports:

Streets & Roads: The Community Crossing grant was awarded and Greenville did not receive any funding. Councilman Lemon will be resubmitting for the next cycle in a couple of months. Councilman Lemon gave a report about a clogged road drainage pipe in Parkland Height, it may require cleaning or replacement soon.

Town Attorney: There are some Stop signs missing in Heritage Springs and are in need of replacement, Councilman Lemon believes we have some signs in the basement and will work on getting the decorative post to mount.

Ordinance 2026-TO-01: AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE PRESIDENT OF THE TOWN COUNCIL TO SIGN AGREEMENTS, CONTRACTS, AND RELATED DOCUMENTS; Motion was made for unanimous consent by Councilman Lemon second by President Redden to approve. Motion passed 4-0.

A Public Hearing for Road Cut Ordinance will be held on February 9, 2026 at 6:45 PM at Greenville Town Hall.

Attorney Peters has been working with Marshal Taylor about setting up a diversion program for tickets for the Town of Greenville.

The dog kennel for the police vehicle needs to be sold by bids. The posting needs to be held twice a least 7 days apart.

Resident Kate Martin sent a video about the snow removal contractor hitting a railroad tie in her yard. The council will follow up about any damages.

Motion made by President Redden and second by Councilman Powell to accept the reconciling for December 2025. Motion passed 4-0.

Moton made by Councilman Powell and second by Presdient Redden to close the town business. Motion passed 3-0.

Utility Business:

Water Utility

Superintendent Steven Webb presented the leak adjustment report which was reviewed and accepted by the council, December water loss remained at 20%.

The compliance is well ahead of schedule. The Water Utility has replaced a T at Highlander Point as part of program.

The monthly maintenance fee for Heritage Springs Sewage Treatment Plant will increase to \$3,300 per month by contract. Motion made by President Redden and second by Councilman Lemon to accept the new rate. Motion passed 4-0,

Superintendent Webb is updating the Capital Improvement Plan.

Motion made by Councilman Lemon and second by President Redden to purchase 100 meters for \$35,000/ Motion passed 4-0.

Sewer Utility:

A new fuel pump was needed for the generator for \$2,000. Superintendent Webb request spending up to \$10,000 for replacement or repair of the generator. The council suggest calling CAT to schedule. Motion passed 4-0.

Property for Galena Water Tower: Motion by President Redden second by Councilman Powell to make an offer on the property. Passed 4-0.

No further business coming before the Council, motion made be President Redden and second by Councilman Lemon to close the utility meeting. Motion passed 4-0. Next monthly meeting set for 7:00 P.M. at town hall located at 9706 Clark Street, on February 9th, 2026.
